Conditions for entry (return) of persons already residing in the territory of the Czech Republic (valid from 15. 6. 2020, 0:00)

These conditions set below apply to:

- a) **Czech citizens**
- b) **EU citizens with proven previous residence over 90 days in the territory of the Czech Republic before March 12th 2020**
- c) **Third country citizens with permanent or temporary residence over 90 days before March 12th 2020**

[Traffic lights] These conditions set below do not apply to:

- a) **Czech citizens, EU citizens with previous residence (settlement) over 90 days in the territory of the Czech Republic before March 12th 2020 and third country citizens with permanent residence over 90 days or temporary residence in the territory of the Czech Republic before March 12th 2020 returning to the territory of the Czech Republic (esp. from holidays, trip, business trip, essential travel) from the stay only in a (green & orange) EU Member State or its parts with a low risk and medium risk of contracting COVID-19**
- b) **Czech citizens and their family members¹ with proven current residence (temporary, long-term or permanent settlement) in a (green) EU Member State or its part with a low risk of contracting COVID-19**

In order to enter the territory of the Czech Republic, these persons do not need:

- o to prove the purpose of travel (and thus belong to one of the exceptions from the entry ban listed below),
- o to time limit their stay in the Czech territory or of travel outside of the Czech territory,
- o to have a PCR testing results certificate with a negative result,
- o to undergo necessary quarantine measures upon entry.

- Citizens of Switzerland, Liechtenstein, Norway, Iceland and the United Kingdom are regarded as EU citizens.
- Pay attention to the measures and restrictions of other states, mainly neighbouring states, which may have different rules of entry and of transit through their territory.

The medical testing results certificate means a document issued by a physician or a public health protection authority confirming that a RT-PCR test on SARS-CoV-2 was done with a negative result; the test cannot be older than 4 days; the test is done on own expenses. The testing results certificate is confirmed on a [template document](#), which is available at the MoI website, or a physician's certificate containing all the requirements listed in the template document may be submitted. In specific cases listed above, the PCR test may be undergone on the Czech territory and the medical testing results certificate must be submitted within 72 hours from the entry to the locally relevant regional hygiene station.

Necessary quarantine measures means, in particular, [quarantine](#) in accordance with Act No. 258/2000 Coll., on the protection of public health and on the amendment of some related acts, or any other form of a movement limitation determined by the hygiene station. The necessary quarantine measure is ordered by a regional hygiene station (**RHS**) respective to place of residence or declared stay, done on the basis of the phone announcement made immediately after the entry to the territory of the Czech Republic.

A free movement limitation within the territory of the Czech Republic means limitation, with the exception of travel to work, necessary travels for the provision of basic necessities, travel to the doctor, travel for the purpose of urgent official affairs, travel back to the place of residence, funerals, for a period of 14 days from the entry into the Czech Republic.
