

Rules for entry and return to the Czech Republic under the Ministry of Health Protective Measure

"A vaccinated person*" is a person that fulfils all the following essentials all at once:

- ✓ is vaccinated in the Czech Republic (this concerns Czech citizens as well as foreign nationals residing in the Czech Republic)
- ✓ the vaccination process has been completed (meaning the person has obtained the second dose in case of two-dose vaccine or has obtained the first dose in case of one-dose vaccine)
- ✓ at least 14 days have passed from the vaccination completion
- √ has been issued with the vaccination certificate by the Ministry of Health of the Czech Republic
- ✓ returns to the Czech Republic from countries with a medium (orange countries) or high (red countries) risk of COVID-19 transmission; these countries are solely some selected countries of the EU and no third country belongs to this category of countries (e.g. Tunisia, Egypt, Turkey, etc.)

ATTENTION: this concerns exclusively the return to the Czech Republic; this does not concern the travel / return to other EZ countries, which apply their own rules.

A. Who may enter the Czech Republic:

ATTENTION: there is a ban for foreign nationals to enter and stay in the Czech Republic for reasons other than: a) travel to work and business or other similar activities; b) provision of care for children, relatives or animals; c) essential travel to health and social facilities services and travels to deal with urgent official or emergency matters, including the provision of necessary escorts of relatives and close relatives; d) attendance of funerals; e) travels to participate in education, including internships and examinations; f) participation in authorized gatherings; g) travels to one's place of residence. Tourism is not permitted.

B. Epidemiological obligations in regard to COVID-19 pandemic

COUNTRIES WITH A LOW RISK OF COVID-19 TRANSMISSION:

- > Entry to the Czech Republic after the stay for more than 12 hours during the last 14 days in a country of departure, which is on the list of countries with a low risk of COVID-19 transmission
- > See the list of countries in accordance with the Ministry of Health Notification issuing a list of countries, or their parts, with a low, medium and high risk of COVID-19 transmission

General rules for everyone:

- ▶ It is obligatory neither to fill in the Public Health Passenger Locator Form prior to the entry, nor to undergo an antigen or RT-PCR test prior or after the entry.
- ▶ There is obligation to wear a respiratory protective equipment in accordance with the general rules.

COUNTRIES WITH A MEDIUM RISK OF COVID-19 TRANSMISSION:

➤ Entry to the Czech Republic after the stay for more than 12 hours during the last 14 days in a country of departure, which is on the list of countries with a medium risk of COVID-19 transmission



> See the list of countries in accordance with the Ministry of Health Notification issuing a list of countries, or their parts, with a low, medium and high risk of COVID-19 transmission

Exceptions from the entry ban and from epidemiological obligations in regard to COVID-19 pandemic: see ANNEX 1 below.

- NOTE: those persons who have been vaccinated in the Czech Republic and who possess the certificate issued by the Czech Ministry of Health, and given the fact that at least 14 days have passed from their vaccination completion:
 - Have obligation to fill in the electronic Public Health Passenger Locator Form (<u>www.prijezdovyformular.cz</u>) and announce the arrival to a locally competent regional public health authority (hygiene station) prior to the entry to the Czech Republic (Step 2) and have obligation to wear a respiratory protective equipment in accordance with the general rules.
 - o Skip all the other steps mentioned below (meaning they do not have to test prior / after the arrival or observe self-isolation).

Rules for Czech citizens, family members* of Czech citizens with an issued temporary residence permit in the Czech Republic, EU+ citizens with an issued temporary residence permit in the Czech Republic and foreign nationals with a permanent residence permit in the Czech Republic:

Public transport travel* (especially by airplane, train, bus):

❖ STEP 1: obligation to undergo an antigen test 24 hours or less or a RT-PCR test 72 hours or less prior to departure to the Czech Republic

Individual transport travel:

❖ STEP 1: - it is not necessary to undergo an antigen or RT-PCR test prior to departure

EXCEPTION IN CASE OF A POSITIVE TEST PRIOR TO ENTRY TO THE CZECH REPUBLIC:

Rules for all other foreign nationals:

Public transport* / individual transport travel:

❖ STEP 1: obligation to undergo an antigen test 24 hours or less or a RT-PCR test 72 hours or less prior to departure to the Czech Republic; with a negative test result

General rules for everyone:

- **STEP 1:** see above according categories of persons
- ❖ STEP 2: obligation to fill in the electronic Public Health Passenger Locator Form (<u>www.prijezdovyformular.cz</u>) and announce the arrival to a locally competent regional public health authority (hygiene station), prior to the entry to the Czech Republic.



- ❖ STEP 3: if requested, obligation to submit a document confirming the filling in of the above mentioned electronic locator form at the border control or residence check.
- ❖ STEP 4: in case of individual transport travel, obligation to undergo an antigen or RT-PCR test at own expense within 5 days from the entry to the Czech Republic (there is **NOT** obligation of self-isolation until the result of the test undergone in the Czech Republic).

Obligation to wear a respirator* outside of home for the duration of 14 days.

ATTENTION:

Employees and students in the Czech Republic: have obligation to inform their employer or school about travels exceeding 12 hours to a country with a medium risk of COVID-19 transmission.

Employers and schools: have obligation to request a negative test result after the entry / return to the Czech Republic in order to permit the entry to a workplace / school.

NOTE: this obligation does not apply to vaccinated persons* entering / returning from a country with a medium risk of COVID-19 transmission.

COUNTRIES WITH A HIGH RISK OF COVID-19 TRANSMISSION:

- Entry to the Czech Republic after the stay for more than 12 hours during the last 14 days in a country of departure, which is on the list of countries with a high risk of COVID-19 transmission
- > See the list of countries in accordance with the Ministry of Health Notification issuing a list of countries, or their parts, with a low, medium and high risk of COVID-19 transmission

Exceptions from the entry ban and from epidemiological obligations in regard to COVID-19 pandemic: see ANNEX 1 below.

- NOTE: those persons who have been vaccinated in the Czech Republic and who possess the certificate issued by the Czech Ministry of Health, and given the fact that at least 14 days have passed from their vaccination completion:
 - Have obligation to fill in the electronic Public Health Passenger Locator Form (<u>www.prijezdovyformular.cz</u>) and announce the arrival to a locally competent regional public health authority (hygiene station) prior to the entry to the Czech Republic (**Step 2**) and have obligation to wear a respiratory protective equipment in accordance with the general rules.
 - o Skip all the other steps mentioned below (meaning they do not have to test prior / after the arrival or observe self-isolation).

❖ STEP 1: obligation to undergo an antigen test 24 hours or less or a RT-PCR test 72 hours or less prior to departure to the Czech Republic; with a negative test result

General rules for everyone:

- STEP 1: see above according categories of persons
- ❖ STEP 2: obligation to fill in the electronic Public Health Passenger Locator Form (<u>www.prijezdovyformular.cz</u>) and announce the arrival to a locally competent regional public health authority (hygiene station), prior to the entry to the Czech Republic.
- STEP 3: if requested, obligation to submit a document confirming the filling in of the above mentioned electronic locator form at the border control or residence check.
- ❖ STEP 4: obligation to undergo a RT-PCR test at own expense within 5 days from the entry to the Czech Republic. The test result will be submitted automatically to the locally competent regional public health authority via an information system.
- ❖ STEP 5: obligation of self-isolation* until the result of the test undergone in the Czech Republic.

Obligation to wear a respirator* outside of home for the duration of 14 days.

ATTENTION:

Employees and students in the Czech Republic: have obligation to inform their employer or school about travels exceeding 12 hours to a country with a high risk of COVID-19 transmission.

Employers and schools: have obligation to request a negative test result after the entry / return to the Czech Republic in order to permit the entry to a workplace / school.

NOTE: this obligation does not apply to vaccinated persons* entering / returning from a country with a high risk of COVID-19 transmission.

COUNTRIES WITH A VERY HIGH RISK OF COVID-19 TRANSMISSION:



➤ Entry to the Czech Republic after the stay for more than 12 hours during the last 14 days in a country of departure with a very high risk of COVID-19 transmission. Countries, which are not on the list in accordance with the Ministry of Health Notification issuing as countries with a low, medium, high or extreme risk of COVID-19 transmission, are considered automatically as countries with a very high risk of COVID-19 transmission.

Exceptions from the entry ban: see ANNEX 2 below

Exceptions from epidemiological obligations in regard to COVID-19 pandemic: see ANNEX 1 below.

Rules for Czech citizens, family members* of Czech citizens with an issued temporary residence permit in the Czech Republic, EU+ citizens with an issued temporary residence permit in the Czech Republic and foreign nationals with a permanent residence permit in the Czech Republic:

- **STEP 2:** obligation to fill in the electronic Public Health Passenger Locator Form (www.prijezdovyformular.cz) and announce the arrival to a locally competent regional public health authority (hygiene station), prior to the entry to the Czech Republic.
- ❖ STEP 3: if requested, obligation to submit a document confirming the filling in of the above mentioned electronic locator form at the border control or residence check.
- ❖ STEP 4: obligation to undergo a RT-PCR test at own expense at the earliest on the 5th day, but at the latest on the 14th day, from the entry to the Czech Republic. The test result will be submitted automatically to the locally competent regional public health authority via an information system.
 - STEP 5: obligation of self-isolation* until the result of the test undergone in the Czech Republic.



Obligation to wear a respirator* outside of home for the duration of 14 days.

ATTENTION:

Employees and students in the Czech Republic: have obligation to inform their employer or school about travels exceeding 12 hours to a country with a very high risk of COVID-19 transmission.

Employers and schools: have obligation to request a negative test result after the entry / return to the Czech Republic in order to permit the entry to a workplace / school. The entry to a workplace / school cannot be permitted prior to the 5th day after the entry / return to the Czech Republic.

COUNTRIES WITH AN EXTREME RISK OF COVID-19 TRANSMISSION:1

- ➤ Entry to the Czech Republic after the stay for more than 12 hours during the last 14 days in a country of departure, which is on a list of countries with an extreme risk of COVID-19 transmission caused by new SARS-COV-2 mutations
- > See the Ministry of Health Protective Measure with the list of countries with an extreme risk of COVID-19 transmission

Exceptions from the entry ban: very limited - see ANNEX 3 below

Exceptions from epidemiological obligations in regard to COVID-19 pandemic: very limited — only international transport workers and children below the age of 5 - see ANNEX 1 below.

STEP 1: obligation to undergo an antigen test 24 hours or less or a RT-PCR test 72 hours or less prior to departure to the Czech Republic

EXCEPTION IN CASE OF A POSITIVE TEST PRIOR TO ENTRY TO THE CZECH REPUBLIC:

¹ From 12. 4. until 31. 5. 2021 there is at the same time entry ban into countries with an extreme risk of COVID-19 transmission for Czech citizens and foreign nationals with a residence in the Czech Republic. This ban does not apply to citizens of countries with an extreme risk of transmission and for travels, which cannot be postponed due to their nature and which were announced beforehand to the Ministry of Foreign Affairs of the Czech Republic.

Rules for all other foreign nationals (this now applies only to family members* of EU+ citizens; EU+ citizens or a third country citizens whose entry is in the foreign policy interest of the Czech Republic or in the interest of the Czech Republic for the public health reasons; accredited members of diplomatic missions in the Czech Republic – other foreign nationals are banned from entering):

❖ STEP 1: obligation to undergo a RT-PCR test 72 hours or less prior to departure to the Czech Republic; with a negative test result

General rules for everyone:

- STEP 1: see above according categories of persons
- * STEP 2: obligation to fill in the electronic Public Health Passenger Locator Form (www.prijezdovyformular.cz) and announce the arrival to a locally competent regional public health authority (hygiene station), prior to the entry to the Czech Republic.
- * KROK 3: obligation to have a reservation confirmation of a RT-PCR test, which will be undergone within 24 hours from the entry to the Czech Republic.
- **STEP 4:** if requested, obligation to submit a document confirming the filling in of the above mentioned electronic locator form at the border control or residence check.
- ❖ STEP 5: obligation to undergo a first RT-PCR test at own expense within 24 hours from the entry to the Czech Republic
- ❖ STEP 6: obligation to undergo a second RT-PCR test at own expense at the earliest on the 10th day, but at the latest on the 14th day, from the entry to the Czech Republic. The test result will be submitted automatically to the locally competent regional public health authority via an information system.
- ❖ STEP 7: until the result of the test undergone in the Czech Republic, there is an obligation of isolation prohibiting free movement with the exception of a) travels absolutely necessary to procure basic necessities of life, to take care of children or to take care of animals, the use of necessary financial and postal services, refuelling vehicles; b) travels to medical facilities; and c) travels back to one's place of residence.

Obligation to wear a respirator* outside of home for the duration of 14 days.

ATTENTION:

Employees and students in the Czech Republic: have obligation to inform their employer or school about travels exceeding 12 hours to a country with an extreme risk of COVID-19 transmission.

Employers and schools: have obligation to request a negative test result after the entry / return to the Czech Republic in order to permit the entry to a workplace / school. The entry to a workplace / school cannot be permitted prior to the 10th day after the entry / return to the Czech Republic.

NOTE: this exception applies only to Czech citizens, family members of Czech citizens with an issued temporary residence permit in the Czech Republic, EU+ citizens with an issued temporary residence permit in the Czech Republic and foreign nationals with a permanent residence permit in the Czech Republic.

- The entry to the Czech Republic is permitted to those persons who have been tested positive for the presence of SARS-CoV-2 less than 14 days prior to the planned entry. These persons shall use individual transport journey, if possible. In case of public transport travel, these persons must inform the carriers about the possible presence of COVID-19 disease prior to the departure.
- After the entry to the Czech Republic, these persons must inform the healthcare professionals carrying out a test for the presence of SARS-CoV-2 and the regionally competent Public Health Office regardless of means of transport

These persons are obliged to observe the rules of isolation upon the entry to the Czech Republic for 3 days from the disappearance of the disease's symptoms but at least for 14 days from the first test, which showed the presence of SARS-CoV-2.

ATTENTION: airlines might apply stricter measures for conducting the transport.
